As part of their strategic direction however, they divested their interest on the said plant in February 2020.

They moved in further the power generation business with their foray into renewable energy through their 10% share in PetroGreen Energy Corp., which is among the proponents of the 32MW Maibarara geothermal power plant project in Batangas; their 20% participation in PetroWind Energy, Inc.'s 36MW Nabas-1wind farm in Aklan; and, their 44% share in the 50MWp Tarlac-1 Solar PV power plant of PetroSolar Energy, Inc. in Luisita, Tarlac. The involvement in these projects is testament to their commitment to environmental stewardship through the utilization and deployment of clean and sustainable energy.

# Powering A Brighter Future with Pilipinas Shell Foundation's **Project SINAG**

Pilipinas Shell Foundation, Inc.

In 2018, the National Electrification Administration reported microgrids, SINAG was able to stop CO2 emissions in these that only 141,300 households or roughly 58% of homes in communities by at least 187.6kg every night or 5,628kg every Palawan were energized.

This limited, and oftentimes insufficient, access to an energy Another microgrid was inaugurated in Sitio Casoyan, San source pushes the community to rely on kerosene lamps and old generators to complete daily tasks and activities. Not only does limited access to electricity hinder the potential of everyone on the island, as Brgy. Captain Felix Talamayan of Brgy Maytequed puts it, but these lamps and generators have adverse effects on the environment and the health of both the wildlife and the locals in the area as well.

Pilipinas Shell Foundation Inc. (PSFI) aims to shine a light on this problem and address it by providing these communities with clean and sustainable energy through project SINAG.

Energy and Technologies. Also known as the Access to Energy (A2E) project, SINAG seeks to provide a reliable, affordable, sustainable, and community-based power source to far-flung sites while conserving their natural resources and surrounding ecosystem.

Established in 2014, SINAG provides reliable energy to offgrid locations that have no immediate prospects of being connected to an electricity grid in the next 5 to 10 years.

For this project, PSFI designed a microgrid to utilize renewable power sources available in the area such as solar, wind, and hydro energy. Careful consideration is given to any significant environmental impact on the target community.

Through SINAG, affected communities are able to reduce their carbon emissions from diesel generators and kerosene lamps, and secure a reliable power source for generations to come.

Having access to energy also means that these communities are able to grow their income. Thanks to a more reliable power source, there is an increase in economic activities and productive hours for domestic and school work too. Maytegued Kindergarden School Teacher, Jasmin Calinog, says that simply the access to a printer has reduced her workload by a significant amount. "We used to do all our visual materials and lesson plans manually (handwritten). Now that preparations are so much easier, we are able to focus on our students more", says Jasmin.

In 2020 alone, the foundation inaugurated two microgrids in Palawan-first in Barangay Maytegued, then in Sitio Albaguen. With an average generation of 4,650 kW per month, the microgrids power 166 households in Maytequed and 117 more in Albaguen, or a total of 283 households. Some 1,315 individuals now have access to energy. Through the

month from the 10 decommissioned generator sets.

Vicente, Palawan last August 5. This power source now provides energy to 140 households and has the capacity for 20 kW solar, 3kW wind, 100kW lithium batteries, and 35 kVA

SINAG also aims to help fence line communities of Shell Import Facility Tabangao or SHIFT. While SHIFT's requirements are powered by its own solar farm, surrounding roads still remain dark due to the absence of streetlights.

To enable safe travels and instill a sense of security among the residents, solar-powered streetlights will be provided SINAG stands for Save, Invest, Nurture Access to Green to SHIFT's surrounding communities under PSFI's SINAG

> Initial installations took place in January over at barangay San Isidro, with work ongoing for barangays Tabangao and Ambulong. Once these installations are completed, SINAG will have provided over 66 solar-powered lampposts to these communities.

> SINAG is in line with PSFI's goal to contribute to the socioeconomic development of sites in need. The target is to ensure universal access to affordable, reliable, and modern energy service by 2030.

> Since its start in 2014, SINAG has been able to provide 24/7 access to energy to 963 households or 4,845 individuals either by microgrid or through individual solar home

> SINAG is just one of the projects PSFI implements to empower Filipinos all over the country. With more programs that respond to the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), the foundation looks forward to driving more progress in moving Filipinos to a more sustainable and

# Accelerated recovery and unprecedented growth, priority of the European-PH community

investors and policymakers gathered together in the two-day European-Philippine Business Summit to provide insights on the recovery path of the Philippines and underscored various policy options to accelerate economic bounceback and improve business resilience.

Lars Wittig, President of the European Chamber of Commerce of the Philippines, in his opening address at the online summit, emphasized the importance of policy reforms to create more jobs, as well as drive unprecedented growth and recovery.

On the same note, H.E. Luc Veron, Ambassador of the Delegation of the European Union to the Philippines, also highlighted the EU's commitment to speed up global vaccination when he shared that the Philippines is among the top 10 beneficiaries of the COVAX facility, which aims to vaccinate 22 million Filipinos. In terms of trade, Ambassador Veron noted that the GSP+ is an important competitive advantage for the Philippines which must be further utilized and maximized. Meanwhile, H.E. Alain Gaschen, Ambassador of the Embassy of Switzerland in the Philippines, underlined the benefits of the European Free Trade Association-Philippines Free Trade Agreement for the country. Among the identified sectors of interest for investments are healthcare and pharmaceuticals, cleantech, fintech, agritech, and rail

From the Philippine perspective on trade and investment, Trade Undersecretary Ceferino Rodolfo briefed summit participants on the status of the ongoing investment promotion campaign as part of the government's economic rebuilding efforts. He also mentioned that the Philippines and South Korea are currently finalizing the bilateral free trade agreement and expressed hopes for the Philippines to conclude a free trade agreement with the European Union.

Mr. Michael Raeuber, Chairman and CEO of Royal Cargo Inc, gave his insights on the current business environment in the Philippines from a European business perspective. He identified 11 sectors including tourism, agriculture and shipping in which European companies should invest. He also presented recommendations to further increase the attractiveness of these sectors for investment. On construction and infrastructure, he commented, "A fair and level playing field created by the DTI and the Philippine Competition Commission on obtaining PCAB licenses is essential for both sides. Done that, I am confident significant investments will follow." Meanwhile, Mr. Ram Maganti, Senior Vice President and Head of Marketing & Innovation of Holcim, highlighted the importance of innovation and sustainability and their role in building back better. Maganti added, "innovations will be a bigger part of our journey at Holcim Philippines. There's a lot of building that will happen in the country in the coming years. With innovations, we can provide our partners with better performing materials that

30 September 2021, Philippines - European and Filipino help them build with less the many essential structures for the country's development."

> Following this, Trish Ramos, the Country Head of Global Trade & Receivables Financing of HSBC Philippines, discussed how the supply chain has evolved throughout the pandemic. HSBC underscored the importance of trade digitization and reported that "86% of corporates said digitization is important or very important."

> In terms COVID-19 response, NTF Strategic Communications Head of Current Operations Assistant Secretary Wilben Mayor provided updates on the vaccine administration efforts of the government. According to him, more than 45 million doses have been administered as of 30 September. Similarly, PA Joey Concepcion highlighted the importance of vaccines to prevent hospitalization, which helps prevent lockdowns that impacts the economy. In view of the quarantine measures, Concepcion recommended moving down to level 3 for the vaccinated to aid with the recovery of the economy.

> On the private sector's end, Sanofi Philippines and Roche talked about how the COVID-19 pandemic has affected and provided opportunities for the healthcare perspective. According to Sanofi Philippines General Manager for Pharmaceuticals Dr. Amal Makhloufi, "To live through this pandemic, it is important that we remain steadfast and proactive in creating solutions to our ongoing problems in the healthcare sector. To be responsive, we need to be flexible in coping with the dynamic nature of this health crisis and collaborate with all stakeholders to move towards realizing the goals of universal health care for every Filipino." Meanwhile, Roche General Manager for Thailand, Myanmar, Cambodia and Laos, Mr. Farid Bidgoli stated that "the challenge of COVID-19 provided us the opportunity to innovate faster, improve on decision-making, and help patients, families, countries, and economies."

> The Summit also featured discussions on growth areas particularly in the financial services sector. BSP Governor Benjamin Diokno shared government initiatives to further facilitate open finance in the country, specifically the BSP Open Finance Strategy 2021-2022 which has three key pillars such as (i) Consultation and Capacity Building (03 2021 - 01 2022), (ii) Governance Standards Issuance (04 2021 - 03 2022), and (iii) Open Finance Pilot Implementation (04 2021) - 04 2022). To end, he added that a collaborative approach is appropriate to encourage industry players to participate and develop innovative solutions, while recognizing the varying level of technical readiness of different institutions. Meanwhile, UBX President & Chief Executive Officer John Januszczak placed emphasis on the importance of accessibility. "What happens when you connect all 110 million Filipinos to a global economy without any barrier to access? UBX's market driven approach to embedding financial services in the activities and experiences that matter for

Diokno and Januszczak have likewise aligned on the government and industry's vision on financial inclusion and transformation.

Closing the event on a positive note, Senator Juan Miguel Zubiri highlighted that "a strengthened business sector between our country and Europe will be instrumental in revitalizing the economy and putting us on the road not just to recovery, but to unprecedented growth and development." To conclude, he called on all stakeholders to work together toward a connected and more vibrant Philippine-European business landscape.




# Work Smart & Well: Identifying Mental Distress at Work | 24 September 2021


# Water Challenge Forum Series: The State of Water in the Philippines 19 October 2021
